

“Little Chicago” filming interviews Dec. 15, 16 and 17th in Bradford

A "Little Chicago" Hollywood crew will start filming supplementary scenes for the movie and background footage with "Speakeasy" interviews of local people that will provide moviegoers and viewers with factual background stories about the Prohibition era in western New York and northeastern Pennsylvania.

Interviews will take place over three days, Dec. 15, 16, and 17, 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., at the Option House Peacock Room at 41 Main Street, Bradford.

People with an important story about Prohibition times will qualify to be interviewed on camera and must have an appointment. A person interviewed could be telling a true story of a relative who lived through the bootleg days and what he or she did, or a story about a friend's or relative's brush with gangsters of the day. No one will be interviewed who doesn't have a compelling, true story that relates to “Little Chicago”, the period piece that is set to be filmed in Bradford, Pa. Real names must be used. Pictures to supplement a story and any Prohibition memorabilia are welcomed.

“We are not looking for actors, just real people with real stories,” explained Carl A. Veno, executive producer of the movie.

The shoot will have live period music and Hollywood production people on the set.
